Whether we are using the meteorological or astronomical definition of the seasons, we are now officially into Spring. With the unseasonable bouts of warm weather, our gardens and countryside are now bursting forth with evidence of new life. We are also now in the period of Lent.

Ollie and I recently visited Manchester Cathedral where, throughout Lent, a huge drape displays a verse from Genesis Chapter 3:

"Remember: thou art dust and to dust thou shalt return."

It serves as a timely reminder of our mortality and, in view of recent events around the world, of the fragility of life.

Of course, the season of Lent culminates in our celebration of Easter.

Often, the first reminder that Easter is on the horizon is the appearance of Easter eggs on the shelves of our supermarkets.

I have heard different explanations of the significance of eggs at Easter.

Perhaps the most obvious, alongside images of cute fluffy chicks, is that it is simply a symbol of new life.

Less obvious, however, is the suggestion that the egg is a reminder

of the stone which sealed the tomb of lesus.

However, in my favourite, the egg symbolises the tomb itself, from which the resurrected Jesus burst forth.

Jesus' tortuous journey to the cross and ultimate death paved the way to new life for all who will receive His forgiveness, mercy and grace. His resurrection demonstrates His victory over death for us all.

As you give and receive eggs this year, let them remind you of the full message of Easter. The message, about our amazing God who showed His love for us in sending His son, Jesus, to die in our place and His power in bringing Him back from the dead.

Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday when Christians remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus on a cruel Roman cross.

So why would this day be called 'good' when it resulted in the tragic and painful death of an innocent man?

The reason is that Jesus' death was for



all of mankind and was part of God's eternal plan for good. When Jesus died on the cross, he took our place, taking upon himself all the wrong things we have done, and taking the punishment on our behalf. Through his sacrifice he has provided the means by which we can be forgiven and have a relationship with God. On the third day, he rose again, defeating death, and providing us with the hope of eternal life.

So in fact Good Friday is not only 'good' but in the words of the songwriter Tim Hughes, it's "the greatest day in history".

This is the Good News of Good Friday, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

The Real Easter Egg

What better way to share the Easter story than through chocolate!

The Real Easter Egg campaign is one of the biggest evangelism initiatives in the UK. It crosses all denominations and offers a simple way to share the Easter Story while supporting Fairtrade and charitable projects.

Out of the 80 million chocolate Easter eggs sold each year in the UK, The Real Easter Egg is the first and only Fairtrade

chocolate Easter egg to share the Easter story. Included with each egg is an Easter story activity book. Over its 24 pages, the story covers the final week of the life of Jesus and includes the events of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

The Real Easter Egg was launched in 2010. It was a real struggle as all the supermarkets turned it down at first. It was left to churches and church schools to place orders and fund



The Meaningful Chocolate Company to begin making The Real Easter Egg. To date, they have sold more than one million eggs with 750,000 of these sent through the post directly to churches and schools. The rest have been sold through independent retailers and supermarkets.

Not only has there been an increase in Fairtrade chocolate sales, but nearly £275,000 has been donated to charitable projects. Also, Fairtrade premium fees are paid to farmers allowing them to invest in their community buying everything from school books and solar panels to providing fresh water.

You can purchase the egg from Morrisons, Tesco, Asda, Waitrose, the CLC Bookshop in Sheffield, as well as online from Eden and Traidcraft.
