Earlier in this chapter Paul calls upon us to:

"Rejoice in the Lord always."

This often feels like a very high, if not impossible, command. However, his call is not to rejoice in our circumstances, good or bad, but to rejoice in the LORD.

As we reflect upon the unfailing goodness of God, His provision and grace, it is my prayer that we will all know a greater measure of the contentment of which Paul speaks and that only God can truly give.

Reading the Bible regularly is a really key thing for us to do to grow in our Christian lives. After all, the Bible is full of God's promises, it teaches us more about God and His will for our lives, it instructs us in righteousness, and is a means by which God can speak to us.

## **Adopt A Child**

For several years now our church has supported the Adopt a Child charity through sponsorship of two children - Alexandro and Daphne. Alexandro has now completed his sponsorship and has therefore left the scheme. Please continue to pray for him as he starts work.

We have decided to continue to sponsor 2 children and we would like to now introduce you to Christoper.

Christoper is 10 years old, his favourite colour is red and he likes to play ball. The Adopt A Child scheme has recently written to us to tell us that Christoper has accepted Jesus as his personal Saviour, which is amazing news.

Being part of the Adopt A Child scheme means that Daphne and Christoper receive good nutritional meals, basic medical and dental care, and are able to go to Bible classes if they wish.

Adopt A Child is the sponsorship program run by the organisation Living Water International. Their vision is "changing the world one child at a time" and their mission is to reach whole families for Christ by ministering to their children. They seek to achieve this through demonstrating God's love - by providing practical care and genuine friendship. As a relationship builds and confidence is established, natural opportunities for evangelism occur.

Adopt A Child provides much needed feeding programmes, evangelistic Bible teaching, basic medical/dental care, local evangelism and church planting. Today in Guatemala over 8,000 children are fed at 9 weekly feeding programs and 9 churches are now scattered throughout the region preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ.

It costs £36 in total each month to sponsor Daphne and Christoper. This cost is met by the church through fund raising events and donations from people of their small change.

Please remember to pray for Daphne and Christoper. Guatemala is a very poor country where most children are required to work from an early age in order to support their families. Only the more fortunate are able to attend school.
