"In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?" John 14:2

Finally let me finish by declaring that we have a strong and certain hope, faith and assurance from our God who is able to immeasurably more than we can ever ask. May we find rest and renewal today as we draw closer to our Lord and his prayer. Amen





A Decade of Real Easter Eggs

The Real Easter Egg campaign has been running since 2010 and involves thousands of churches, schools and groups. It crosses all denominations and offers individuals a simple way to share the Easter Story while supporting Fairtrade and charitable projects.

The idea began in 2008 when David Marshall was given a chocolate Easter Egg. David explained: "On the side of the box it read: 'Easter is the festival of chocolate and loveliness'. I began to wonder – was it right for the manufacturer of an Easter egg to change the meaning of a religious festival in this way? Imagine the outcry if this had been done to Christmas. I searched for an Easter egg which mentioned the Christian story of Easter. It became clear that out of the 80 million eggs on sale there was not a single manufacturer who was willing

to mention the religious aspects of the festival. So I started The Meaningful Chocolate Company to manufacture the UK's first 'Real Easter Egg'. For it to be a 'Real Easter Egg' it had to reflect the Easter themes of hope and new life and do three things – have a copy of the Easter story in the box, be made from Fairtrade chocolate and support charitable causes."



Ten years on, more than a million eggs have been sold with over

 $750,\!000$ sent through the post directly to customers. The rest have been sold through retailers and supermarkets. Nearly £275,000 has been donated to charitable projects with Fairtrade Premium fees paid to farmers allowing them to buy everything from school books and solar panels to providing fresh water.


For Easter 2020, there are five types of Real Easter Eggs available all with new content. Each egg has an edition of the Easter story included. There is a new 24 page version in the Original and Dark eggs with activities, biblical text and a prize competition worth £200. Both the Original and Dark 2020 eggs are plastic free and all their chocolate is Palm Oil free.

You can purchase the egg from Morrisons, Tesco, Asda, Waitrose, the CLC Bookshop in Sheffield, as well as online from Eden and Traidcraft.

Reading through the Gospels with The 'Lumo Project'

In our recent Sunday morning talk by David Skeet on 'L for Learn' in our 'BELLS' series we were encouraged to read right the way through one of the gospel books of the Bible (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John) in one sitting. David explained that, when we go through a whole gospel, we get to see the themes and rhythms running through it and learn what Jesus is saying and doing - a great way to get to know Jesus. Jesus himself told us in John's gospel: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14 v16)



David suggested that we should take some time out

to do this, maybe finding the time by missing out on watching our favourite soaps, shows or sporting events on TV. Well one way to achieve this, without having to turn off the TV at all, comes thanks to the 'Lumo Project'!

"The Lumo Project goal was to film all four of the gospels in the most realistic and authentic way possible and share the gospels for a visual age. For the first time, four full length feature films tell the story of the life of Jesus of Nazareth, told from the different perspectives of the gospel writers, word for word, unabridged. This project was shot throughout 2013 on Moroccan locations, bringing a really authentic feel yet contemporary style to these first century texts."

The most significant difference between this and previous gospel films is that instead of dialogue, each film has a narration consisting of the full, word for word, text of the gospel. So, if you want, you can switch on the subtitles and/or follow along with your bible open in front of you. Another great thing about these films are that they help with experiencing the natural flow of the text of



the gospels, without the distraction of the chapter and verse structure. A choice of King James or NIV versions of the bible is currently available.

They are also a great resource for homegroups, and in the Tuesday evening homegroup we have been working through the gospel of John, using the 'Lumo Project' DVD as a focus for each passage we study. We have found them particularly helpful in visualising more clearly the people and places featured in the Bible.

How much time you have may determine which gospel you choose to look at! Running times are as follows: Matthew – 190 mins, Mark – 103 mins, Luke – 207 mins, John – 160 mins.

The DVDs are available through Amazon and all Christian retailers. There are lots of clips available online, and you can find out much more by simply searching for 'Lumo Project' on YouTube.
