


What's On

- 6th January


Church Members' Meeting will be held on Sunday 13th December after the morning service.

I recently gave a short talk at the ladies meeting. The Lord gave me a word concerning "The Big Picture" - God's purpose / destiny that we need to keep in view. I feel that it is of great help to us to be aware in these days, that God our Father in Heaven is working out a glorious purpose, to which He has called those that are "in Christ" throughout the world.

To grasp this can help us make some sense of how God will use the present challenges to shape His true Church. The oyster has an organ that produces a chemical and uses this to turn the stuff that "gets under its skin" into a beautiful pearl. I wonder what's getting under your skin at this time? I want you to know that, if you trust Him, God can use hard times to make you who He's fashioning you to be.

This brings me to "The Big Picture". I like to think of God loving His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, so greatly that He longs for many more like Him. Hebrews 2:10 speaks of God "bringing many sons to glory". Romans 8:29 similarly speaks of God's purpose that we be "conformed to the likeness of His Son".

In the ladies meeting I sought to bring encouragement that what God has begun in us He WILL complete. As in Philippians 1:6, God is at work in you, and will finish the job! This can involve His loving discipline. God will use, and is using, I believe, life's challenges to refine our faith, to develop our patience, to strengthen our endurance, and so to develop our character as true disciples of

Jesus Christ. (The Apostle Paul addresses this in Romans 5:1-5 and 1 Peter 1:1-9).

Who said being a true Christian is easy? In fact it is impossible to live up to, except that He gives His helper, the Holy Spirit, to those who ask Him. Surely this is the key.

Love divine, all loves excelling,
Joy of heav'n to earth come down:
fix in us thy humble dwelling,
all thy faithful mercies crown:
Jesus, thou art all compassion,
pure, unbounded love thou art;
visit us with thy salvation,
enter ev'ry trembling heart.
