Due to the pandemic, this year the annual Baptist Assembly was held online. On May 16th our church, along with hundreds of others, were able to gather together virtually for a special Sunday service. Our church family gathered in our church building, and also from their own homes to join in this special event. Shane Claiborne was the guest speaker for the event. Shane is a prominent speaker, activist, and best-selling author. Shane worked with Mother Teresa in Calcutta, and founded 'The Simple Way' in Philadelphia. He heads up 'Red Letter Christians', a movement of folks who are committed to living 'as if Jesus meant the things he said'. Shane is a champion for grace which has led him to jail advocating for the homeless, and to places like Iraq and Afghanistan to stand against war. Now grace fuels his passion to end the death penalty and help stop gun violence.

Shane's talks focussed on:

- 'What is God's perfect dream where you live?'
- 'Lean into the suffering of the world.'

During the Assembly there were some great seminars and discussions with our fellow Baptist family covering topics such as:

- 'We can't breathe until you can' exploring the topic of white privilege from a white person's point of view.
- 'Walking with Jesus through a changing climate' exploring the issues of the climate and environmental crisis.

There was also a presentation from BMS World Vision (Baptist Missionary Society). This celebrated the amazing achievement of BMS' vision - 1.3 million lives transformed over the last 5 years. There were times of doubt as to whether this could be achieved, but the teams remained faithful and strong in God's vision and mission, seeing fruits beyond their hope, dreams and prayers. What an amazing God! The presentation also launched their exciting plans for work amongst the most marginalised and least evangelised people as they respond to the changing needs of the world with sensitivity and insight.
