At the start of the pandemic, when the school's first shut, I told my two children "you're living through history". We are very excited to have Junior Church re-starting on 26th September with the Messy Church service for Harvest.

Junior Church is for school-age children and meets every Sunday. Sunday 24th October: Café Church (sit, chat, have breakfast and do some activities if you feel like it).


Sunday 19th December: Christmas Celebration



Café Church is a very informal church service for all ages. If you've not been before, it's rather different to what you might imagine "church" is. It's aimed at everyone, of all ages, whether you normally attend a church or not.

At Café Church you'll find the chairs set out around tables – much like in a "normal" café. There might be a quiz, or some craft – but there's no pressure to do it. A breakfast is provided by our wonderful catering team (usually we have bacon or sausage butties, pastries and drinks) but most of all, it's a fantastic opportunity to sit and chat. Towards the end of the service, there will be a very short talk from one of our church leaders.

We hold Café Church on two Sundays during the year. The next one will be Sunday 24th October.
