



#### New website 'Sunday Service Recordings' page

We now have a new look 'Sunday Service Recordings' page on the church website: <a href="mailto:swallownestbaptist.org.uk/sermons">swallownestbaptist.org.uk/sermons</a>

Previously the page only included the weekly Sunday service audio recordings in MP3 format, but the new page now has additional content. In particular it includes our YouTube livestream recordings embedded alongside the audio recordings. It also features our sermon series images, and mini pictures of our speakers.



There is an easy feature for filtering by 'Series', 'Speaker' or 'Book' of the bible, back to December 2021:

It's worth pointing out that our YouTube page doesn't have any search feature other than the date of the recording. So this is a useful place to come, instead of going directly to YouTube, if you want to locate a particular past YouTube livestream, or everything from a particular sermon series.

Our weekly podcast of the Sunday morning services also continues to be available but has moved to a new address. It's a great resource for listening 'on the move'. The podcast includes all spoken parts of the service but times of sung worship are edited out for copyright reasons.
